## Commentary: Negative Emotions by Don Brown

A little while back in one of our topical study groups we investigated Half Truths\* – statements that sound good, but which are not altogether based on the teaching we receive from God’s Word. These sayings have some kind of truth behind them but are easily mistaken to justify a not-so-good worldview. One of these sayings is, perhaps, the most insidious of all - “Hate the sin, not the sinner”. It sure sounds wise on the surface, but, at its core, there is an element that is harmful. I say it’s most insidious, as I think it is something that is causing a lot of turmoil in many of our institutions now, that is, in many of our earthly organizations.

As we look at the life of Jesus as presented though the Gospels, we see that He, at times, showed some anger at the religious establishment and at those taking advantage of the religious practices. However, He also had meals with and had loving instruction for these same people. We may find anger rising in us, but we are not to “let the sun go down” on that anger. It is not to exert an ongoing influence on our emotional center. I would extend that to any negative emotion – anger, fear, hatred and guilt. Our prime motivation for the actions that represent our character is to be love.

Negative emotions are to be transient. We recognize they may come up, but they are not to take up extended residence in our emotional center to where they work their way into our character.

We need to watch out for this in the influencers in our earthly institutions. Whenever we feel that someone is trying to influence our emotions with hatred, fear, anger, or guilt, we need to recognize the true source behind these directions and respond with Jesus’ command when Peter was trying to instill fear about where Jesus was heading in His journey – “Get behind me, Satan”.

*“In your anger do not sin.” Do not let the sun go down while you are still angry, and do not give the devil a foothold.”*

*(Ephesians 4:26-27 NIV)*
