New Year's Greetings to the Saints in Christ,

Ecclesiastes 3:1 -8 indicates there is an appointed time for everything. There is a time for every event under heaven—A time to give birth and a time to die...a time for war and a time for peace. What is evident is that for every action, there is in the proper time, an equal and opposite reaction. Every activity, either positive or negative, has its season, and the seasons have their own rhythm in the cycle of life. Permanence is not part of the human condition. People are not the shapers of life, rather people are recipients of life. We become preoccupied with toil as part of our God-given lot in life. We toil by the sweat of our brow thinking we accomplish nothing that is enduring. We are afflicted by busy-ness, often without aim.

Catherine said, "That tea party was fantastic and fancy and fun."



Pledging, and How to Give Online by Kathy Gordon

I received an email after I submitted my tithing pledge for 2023, which included my yearly amount of my 2023 pledge, how I will designate the funds to be used (I prefer “Current Envelope”), Progress Updates as to how I am reaching my pledged goal, the Donation Period, and information about setting up Recurring Donations. I am grateful for having these reminders so that I am mindful of my tithing.

The option to set up Recurring Donations, was a link in the email, at <https://fumchs.churchcenter.com/giving>. I have used the Church Center App, so I opened the app on my iPhone, selected “More” on the bottom menu, which brought me to “Give” or “Forms/Requests.” After I selected “Give”, I followed the prompts for Amount, Fund, Frequency, Payment Method, and the option to “Cover the \$0.30 processing fee.” When my recurring donations happen, I get a confirmation through text or email. If you need help with the Church Center App, just ask for Kathy Gordon or Don Brown in the church office.
