## **From Pastor Tim**

What is Your Intention?

My ninth grade Civics teacher, Mr. Bruhn, gave us the assignment to think about a career choice, and then to gain knowledge about it through research and an interview with someone currently in that career. At fourteen, my intention was to become a computer programmer and make \$10,000 a year. It didn't work out that way, I can happily say!

We intend to be and to do many things in our lives, and not all of them are fulfilled. Sometimes that elicits great disappointment; sometimes we say, "Thank you, Lord, that it turned out differently for me." But this I know is true: without clear intention, followed by a long-term plan of action, most of what happens in our lives is the

result of chance or circumstance or what someone else chooses for us. Much of what we intend is sabotaged by short-term thinking.

Dr. Henry Cloud is a clinical psychologist who, over the years, has also served as a business consultant and leadership coach and speaker. I have often heard him speak at Christian leadership conferences. He traffics in wisdom and truth-telling. In his book, *Nine Things You Simply Must Do to Succeed in Love and Life*<sup>1</sup>, Dr. Cloud writes:

*Sowing and reaping is much bigger than the immediate connection between what I am doing now and what will occur immediately following. Sowing and reaping is about what I will ultimately end up with (take in, live with, be stuck with, and so on) if I sow this particular behavior, choice, attitude, value, or strategy. It is the long-term view. More accurately, it is the end view. What will happen in the end? is the question the wise person seeks to answer.*

He uses the phrase “playing the movie to the end” to describe intentionality. “Any one thing you do is only a scene in a larger movie. To understand that action, you have to play it out all the way to the end of the movie.”

Beginning this January, we will explore what it means to live an intentional life. Have you long desired to develop a creative gift? Dreamed of traveling to new places? What are you doing to transform the dream into reality? Do you desire to be a “good” person? If so, what does being good and doing good look like over a long period of time? What is the end result? What will you have at the end of the movie when the credits are rolling? Do you intend to become a faithful follower of Jesus? Do you intend to be generous with your resources? What does “storing up treasure in heaven” mean? Desires and dreams, without intentionality, remain desires and dreams. Develop the muscle of intentionality and you can take the first of many steps toward that for which your heart longs.

I hope to see you intentionally in worship this Sunday.
